





 - From a study of Business Law I, students should gain a genuine respect and an intelligent appreciation for the law that affects them both at home and at work.


AP Psychology

 - Social Psychology




Psychology

There are many projects that involve finding ways to make our school and community more environmentally friendly. We will continue to build on the plans from previous years as well as make new proposals as we see the need.


Geoscience



College Level Math Courses

College Algebra (MATH 113)

Drama 1 is an introductory theatre performance course. Students can expect to learn about the basics of theatre, as well as perform in pantomime, improvisation, monologues and acting scenes. We play a lot of games that focus on developing creativity and thinking on our feet. Students will be expected to perform in front of classmates, to be good audience members and to memorize for performances. This is a good class for those who either want to get out of their shell and work on presentation skills in a safe environment and/or for those who love being creative and creating stories.

What is Drama 11?

Drama II is the next level of theatrical performance training at CCHS (Drama 1 is a prerequisite). Drama II students can expect to go deeper into the skills and history learned in Drama 1, as well as writing original scenes and analyzing scripts. If you took Drama 1 and are interested in learning more about theatre and performance, Drama 11 is for you!

Speech and Debate Classes and Information

Debate I

PLTW Biomedical Sciences Courses

Principles of Biomedical Science (1 credit) 9-12 Grade **Prerequisite: Teacher recommendation. **Can be taken in place of Physical Science. By engaging in activities like dissecting a sheep heart, analyzing medical history documents and autopsy reports, students explore concepts of biology and medicine to determine factors that led to the death of a fictional person.

Human Body Systems (1 credit) Grade 10-12

**Prerequisite: Biology In order to determine the identity of a skeleton using both forensic anthropology and NA analysis, students examine the interactions of human body systems and apply what they know to solve real-world medical cases.

Medical Interventions (1 Credit) Grade 11-12 **Prerequisite: Biology Students delve into activities like designing a prosthetic arm as they follow the life of a fictitious family and investigate how to prevent, diagnose, and treat disease.

Biomedical Innovations (1 Credit) Grade 12

**Prerequisite: MI Students build on the knowledge and skills gained from previous courses to design their own innovative solutions for the most pressing health challenges of the 21st century.

This course is eligible to all incoming sophomores, juniors and seniors!





Journalistic Writing: "a little bit of everything" (1 semester course)

Journalistic Writing is designed for students with an interest in journalism and those who intend to take Newspaper Production or Yearbook Production, but also want an introduction to the world of journalism!

This class is structured around the different literary movements that have occured in American history from Enlightenment to Postmodernism (1765 to present day).


Each movement (units in the class), will allow you to read a wide range of literature, think about the historical context around each text, and cultivate critical reading, writing, and analysis skills to help you be successful both inside and outside the class!

AP Language and Composition

AP Language and Composition is an advanced English course for juniors and seniors. It is a challenging class that will help a student both prepare for college and potentially get college credit. Mystery, Suspense, and Horror (1 semester)

Mystery, Suspense, and Horror is an English Elective. In this course, we will review and analyze many foundational texts that revolve around werewolves, vampires, creatures from the unknown, etc. While this class includes a fair amount of traditional reading, we will also be viewing movies, listening to music, playing games, etc. These activities will give you the opportunity to both analyze and create works of horror. If you are interested in these types of stories and would like to further your understanding of this genre, then this is the class for you.



Creative Writing (1 Semester)

Creative Writing is an English Elective. As the name of this class implies, this is a writing heavy course. Throughout the semester, you will be given the opportunity to learn various techniques and strategies to improve your own creative writing. The course is split up into two units: Creative Short Fiction and Poetry. With that said, you will get the chance to develop skills in writing these two genres. If you enjoy writing and have a knack for creativity, this is the class for you.
